It has been a hard winter for some souls in our midst and around the world. Grief, illness, harsh treatments and therapies for disease and injury, loved ones in rough circumstances. Wars, rumors of wars, strong storms, and floods with tremendous damage, train accidents leaving behind toxic waste, places where drought rules the season, and the list goes on.

We are more than ready for the good news of Easter. We are more than ready for signs of new life around us and in our souls. If you have followed any of the prayer cards for Lent, some of the daily questions really hit home. Where do you find your peace? When all seems lost, how do you hold onto hope? On Good Friday, as you ponder Jesus bearing his cross to the place of crucifixion, the prayer card question is "What are you afraid of"? Wow. Maybe some of those questions have opened you to prayer in a new way or put a notion or action in mind that grows your faith, and serves the will and way of Jesus Christ.

The truest sign of spring is upon us; our celebration of Easter. The resurrection of Jesus Christ and the promise of new life, renewed life, his resurrection brings to us. If you have died with Christ- if you have taken the journey to the cross, wrestled with the questions, and remembered that you belong to him- then you are raised with Christ. You demonstrate your new life in Christ by how you live, how share love, faith and hope, how you bear witness to the call to do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with God.

Here is the affirmation of faith for Easter prepared by A Sanctified Art:

We believe in resurrection—mysterious, beyond our understanding, and yet, like tulips after the snow: **real.**

We believe in Easter morning— in the promise of a God who would roll back every stone to return to us.

We believe in Jesus—who calls **us** by name and asks, "Who are you looking for?"

So we look—for justice, for mercy, for God in our midst. And as we look, we sing, "Alleluia!"

- 2. **On Motion**: to transfer \$ 1000 annually to the Deacons from the undesignated part of the memorial fund to be used for In house mission needs. **So approved.**
- 3. **On motion**: to move the excess savings (from Stauffer account), memorial funds and bequest and current money market plus fund into one account with individual tracking. **So approved**.
- 4. We ask the WeKirk Foundation board to meet in the spring/summer to determine those who can ask for disbursement of funds and add clerk of session to the list.
- 5. We will need to find a couple people to serve as counters in the near future. Sue King is interested; interested people should contact the pastor or treasurer.

Presbytery Meeting will be May 16 at 3 pm Bowling Green. Pam will serve as commissioner.

The MVP Disaster Assistance Team will travel to Kentucky from Oct 8 - 14 for hurricane relief. This is open to all.
