
~ Pastor's Corner ~

Projects list for the Church- Can you help?

The roof is sealed and no leaks detected since the spring. Things need shaping up inside the building. We plan to schedule a couple of work nights to accomplish some of this. Watch for dates to be announced. If you can handle one of these yourself, please let Pastor Ann or Curtis Richards know.

Ceiling Tiles- all Floors, especially top floor & East Entrance

Lights- bulbs replaced in conference room; light fixture at top of the stairs by the chapel

Blinds in Chapel, the hallway, WeKirk Room (upstairs), and in the Craft Room (main floor)- new blinds needed in some places.

Water Damage Repair: WeKirk and Craft rooms- (scrape and paint)

Water Damage Repair: East Entrance, North Entrance to Sanctuary; need to be scraped and repainted- there may be a need for dry wall in the North entrance.

Ensign House: removing the hedge at the front and repairing the "fence" around the basement to guard against ground hogs.

Thank you to Curtis for cleaning gutters, handling bats at Ensign House, working to schedule a company to fix the pneumatic doors to the elevator and the thermostat in the Wekirk room. With help, he and Foyle got the bushes out by the East Entrance earlier this spring. Thank you to Charlie for the new bright tape on the stairs and with Foyle, for spraying for weeds this spring and summer. Thank you to Mike Peffley, Gary Bishop and all those looking after the garden, and to Foyle for mowing. It has been a busy mowing season. We have Marsha to thank for the lovely flower pots and Lora & Craig Richards for the bench at the East Entrance, which makes it all look very nice. The bench has come in handy already!

We keep a list of things needed done- look for it on the bulletin board to fill in when you notice something.

We are making plans to work on the fire escape doors and the Ed building front door as well. There are some longer- term projects on our list.

Projects

Highlights of the Session Meeting June 27, 2023 ~ Your Session at work

We continue the discussion of what is next for us, and considered questions we have as we meet with St. John UCC leaders on July 17 at 7 pm. Ann has developed a shared ministry finance sheet which outlines costs estimates for sharing a pastor or hiring a part time pastor.

Ann and Norm will spend Thanksgiving in Tulsa, Nov 20-27, including Sunday Nov. 26 and will spend a fall weekend in Atlanta. Ann will also take a couple weekdays in late July and after Christmas.

The insurance payment has increased as expected, \$3000 per year to \$15,000. Marsha will pay quarterly from cash flow, which will only cost a few dollars extra each quarter. The property value has increased.

Garden News: Cucumbers, zucchini, dill, basil, and parsley are ready, and perhaps potatoes.

Tools for Schools

Help will be needed for the following dates.

- Wednesday, August 9 at 6 pm for final organization for Saturday.
- Saturday, August 12 from 12 to 4:30 and then Sunday, August 13 from 12:30 to 3:30 pm Distribution! We will need some help for clean up too!
- Friday, August 18--Back to school haircuts at Salon 206 AND Bloomfield Barbershop from 3 pm to 8 pm. This event only needs a few workers, probably 3 each for 2 shifts. We will have space in the Twist It Yoga studio and Rich will set up games.
- We have received a total of \$13,300 from various community organizations to support this work.

Ann will present a clipboard for sign up to do some of the following property work.

- 1. Vestibule on side entrance to sanctuary--clean gutters, scrape and repaint stain glass-window, seal?
- 2. Scrape and repaint East entrance ourselves-
- 3. Indoor repair work top Floor and main Floor, ceiling tiles.
- 4. LIGHT at top of the stairs to Chapel
- 5. There are bats in the basement at the Ensign House.
- FOYLE found someone to cut out brush near the parking lots.
- Curtis is trying to find someone to work on pneumatic doors on the elevator.
- Charlie will spray poison ivy on driveway behind Ensign House and will do orange tape on the stairs.

The youth group announces that they need detergent bottles and would prefer smaller ones. We anticipate using the Nooma videos for the pizza and program nights in the fall.

CE will meet August 15 at 5:45 pm. Session meets with St John leaders on July 17 and then as session on August 22 at 7 pm.
