#### Pastor's Corner

The year 2023 went by fast for me! Now to 2024 and the changes ahead for us all. The old saw is "The only thing that is constant is change." That certainly holds true.

Our daughter got Cat Tarot cards for Christmas for fun- she volunteers at a cat shelter and the cards are hilarious. I played and one of the cards drawn was "Death" (facing away from me). The card pictured a vacuum- and if you know cats, then you know the vacuum is tantamount to a death machine, never mind the Roomba ads. (in Cat Tarot, The Devil Card is a dog) I have never had a cat that would ride a vacuum. So, what does the Death card facing away mean? It means facing change. For the cat, know that the vacuum will change the terrain, but not kill you.

#### Pastor's Corner (cont)

In 2024 we embark on an experiment for a terrain change in ministry. It does not portend doom. We have a Shared Ministry team between our church and St John UCC who will work together on a plan to share a pastor into the future. Pastor Jim Brehler retires just after Easter, and sometime in April, by May 1, I will be the shared pastor for First Presbyterian Church and St John UCC. Between now and then, this shared ministry team will work out the details, especially worship times for each congregation and how the financial terms of call will be shared. This initial time is an experiment to see how it works; if both parties are satisfied, then the two churches would look for a pastor to share into the future.

I have had some experience in this; my first parish was a 2- point charge- when I came, they had been sharing a pastor for 40 plus years. I was pastor of a shared ministry between a Presbyterian and a Lutheran Church for almost 10 years in Hobart OK. All of those congregations are still active.

As you know, our congregation runs a deficit budget annually and pledges bring in new money that basically covers staffing and *some* of the rest of the budget. We rely on legacy gifts for our Christian Ed. ministry and other expenses. Sharing the cost of a pastor will certainly cut into that deficit.

We still have legacy gifts that can be used; the session has preserved the Stauffer Fund over the years and it is still substantial, along with some smaller bequest monies we can begin to use. We also have Defiance Area Foundation monies that can be used for major repairs and mission. We managed to put on a new roof without a capital campaign by using some of these resources; they remain for us to use, as needed.

Some of the ideas floated to help us get better acquainted with the congregation at St Johns in a shared ministry include having joint worship services on 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays, keeping the Auglaize Village service going, and making an effort to invite one another to activities. PW & F has had this practice for some time, and many of you are acquainted with the good folks at St John UCC. They already have been helping us with Tools for Schools and we can help them more with their Little Pantry project.

Change is an opportunity to grow in faith, service and hope. I am encouraged by the Spirit that this is the right move for us, and will enhance the ministries of both congregations. Last year I began to sense that my call to this church was to help you determine "What's next!" and in the Session, we have been carefully considering just that. I encourage us all to engage this change in the spring, try it on, tweak it, and move forward!

#### **Mission Matters**

The Tools for Schools Steering Committee includes 3 people from our church plus 4 or 5 other community leaders especially from the organizations which helped us this past summer. We have a good outline of tasks thanks to the good recordkeeping by Rich and Pam Reid. We also have inventory to begin with and some money too. This Steering Committee will get the ball rolling for this summer's Tools for Schools drive and distribution. Look forward to hearing from them soon.

#### RED PEPPER CRACKERS

- 1 box saltines (salted or unsalted)- open and place all crackers in large container with a lid Mix:
- 1 1/3 cup canola oil
- 1 pkg ranch dressing mix
- 1 tsp ground red pepper
- 1 tsp red pepper flakes
- 2 tsp garlic powder

Pour over the crackers, close lid.

Turn the container every 5 minutes for 30 minutes then let set over night or for several hours. Repack crackers in a clean container.
