Pastor's Corner

At session meeting, I wondered out loud if there was a patron saint of coats- this is our 36th year of Coats for Christmas. Pam replied that St Martin is venerated all over Germany for that. St Martin of Tours was a 4th century evangelist and Bishop of Tours (by popular "election" of the townspeople) c 371 CE, so very early in the history of the established Christian Church.

He was born in what is now Hungary, grew up in what is now Italy and died in Tours, France in 397. His feast day is Nov. 11. Martin Luther, born November 10 and baptized November 11, 1483 was named for him, as was the custom. So there is a Reformation connection.

The story goes that as a soldier, Martin of Tours came across a poor man barely clothed. Martin cut his own coat in half with his sword and shared the other half with the poor man. He had been introduced to the Christian faith, and as he went through catechumen (education in the faith), he determined he could no longer be a soldier, thus becoming the first conscientious objector. The army released him from service. He is the patron saint of the poor, soldiers, conscientious objectors, tailors (coat makers) and
