#### Pastor's Corner ~

What's next for our church, our mission, our pastoral leadership? These have been topics of discussion this year at the meetings of the session. On Sept 17, we brought the discussion to the congregation so that we all can enter into the discussion about what is next in ministry for our congregation.

The Session has looked at the long- range financial picture. With pledges to the budget, the investment/ legacy monies available from several sources, we are doing fine for another few years. Cutting back on costs for pastoral services would help extend that time.

When we looked at numbers, we also considered the age and energy level of our congregation. We are stable in numbers of active people but not growing. Our "worker bees" are also aging and while we want to continue our ministries, particularly to the community, we need help. We instigate community ministries with Tools for Schools and Coats for Christmas; we can gather in more helpers and planners to work with us in making these community ministries thrive.

The Session agreed to begin this planning while we have a pastor on board, particularly since this pastor has some experience in shared ministry- that is, having served in two different shared ministries as a full- time pastor in both Missouri and Oklahoma.

The Session met with the Consistory (board) at St John United Church of Christ in July; we are in the same basic situation with respect to finances and numbers of people at worship and in mission. We agreed to form a joint steering committee to work toward a shared ministry covenant between the 2 congregations. The shared ministry would involve the two congregations sharing a pastor. Both congregations would remain open and active in work and worship; the 2 congregations would share a full- time pastor and the costs for having a full- time pastor. Any changes will not happen immediately; there are several give and take discussions to be had on the topics of worship times, ministries, financial obligations, and more.

The discussion has begun. We plan to use time this fall to continue the discussion around our dinner tables perhaps at Pizza & Program on Oct. 25 or our November 8 Wednesday night dinner.
