September is "A Season of Peace" as we prepare to receive the Peace and Global Witness offering on World Communion Sunday, October 1.

This is the first year we are a 4 x4 church! We will have taken up all 4 Special Offerings. Next up is Peace and Global Witness- the theme comes from Psalm 23 "You are with me". How can we find our peace without the presence of God? How do we spread the news that God is always with us in Jesus Christ? How do we demonstrate that in our daily living- showing the peace of Jesus Christ?

Half of the offering goes to the national church for work on peacemaking and global witness project like those addressing human trafficking in places like Madagascar with the Church of Jesus Christ there, one of our World Mission Global partners. 25% goes to our presbytery for regional work and 25 % stays with our church. What project promotes peacemaking in our area? How can we help?

Lord Jesus, our good shepherd, as we declare that "you are with us", help us remember that you are with all your children all around the world. Give us the wisdom and direction we need to be with them in love, prayer and service as you are with us all. In Christ, through Christ and with Christ, we pray. Amen.

Highlights of the Session Meeting August, 2023 ~ Your Session at work

On Saturday, Oct 7 from 9 -3, a seminar will be held at the Presbyterian church in Sandusky, OH. The topic of the day will be Tod Bolsinger's book *Canoeing the mountains, Christian Leadership in Uncharted Waters*. The cost is \$30 or \$35(after Sept 30). The concept was based on the Lewis and Clark expedition, when they traversed the west via river, but suddenly came to the mountains and had to figure out a new way forward. We can let the rivers of the past go and look to the mountains ahead, asking "Why do we exist? What would be lost if we ceased to be? What purposes and principles must be protected as central? What are we willing to let go of for the sake of the mission?" All are invited to attend. Let Pastor Ann know if you are interested.

The sympathies of the congregation go out to the family of Nancy Jehanyar, officially a new member, who passed to the church eternal on August 4, 2023. The family plans a graveside on September 16 in Napoleon Cemetery and a meal back at the church. Michelle & Joe's aunts want to cook the meal.

The Session met with St. John United Church of Christ Consistory on July 17. Pastor Ann shared information about what it could look like to share a pastor. She will initiate a conversation with the congregation on Sept. 17th and a steering committee will be formed.

The letter asking for support for the Mexico scholarships has been mailed.

Leadership changes are coming. We will need a new clerk in 2024. (Pam will finish the year end and will be available to assist/train someone.) Ann will check the list of signatories for the bank accounts and we can ask someone on that list to work with Marsha to sign checks as needed. Pam will ask designated people to serve as counters. Marilyn and Jim will train them.

Ann will be on vacation Sept 21 - 26 including Sunday, Sept 24, then November 20 - 27 including Sunday, Nov. 26, and also occasional days here and there.

Marsha provided the financial reports. Pam mentioned that the required minimum distribution from an IRA can be directed as a charitable gift tax free and is a great way to support the church.

There has been great turnover of product in the garden. Neighbors are bringing produce to share. Again we received the gift of canned goods. This is a wonderful ministry in the neighborhood.

Tools for Schools was an amazing experience of joyful service. 58 different workers served over 290 kids of Defiance for 2 days of Tools for Schools supply distribution. The volunteer pool came from our church, St Mary, Zion Lutheran, UCC, St John's Catholic, GIVES from State Bank. 24 organizations gave funding via grants and/or school supplies to support the event. The Back-to-School haircut program had 7 stylists, 6 workers and 89 kids who got fresh haircuts, had a chance to play games while they waited and loved Justin the Clown and his balloon art.

Ann, Pam and Rich took the requested supplies to Defiance Middle School after the event to serve 20 students. The principal reports that there are always students who come with no materials. Rich put together a slide show of photos from both events. It was shown in worship and will be used to report to the Synod and MVP.

Ann will bring together a steering committee for next year in January. The Reids will leave all the documentation and files and will gladly consult/help.

There is funding left over that will be start up funds for the next couple years. It is important to request grant money for various groups before March of 2024, in order to meet their deadlines.

Ann encourages us to move forward on some of the projects this fall.

- Curtis suggests that we need a couple work days to help clean up and get spaces ready for projects, like in the vestibule and the craft room. Beth will talk to her daughter in law about plastering. Bethany has recently completed some projects successfully.
- The window area in the East Entrance needs work.
- The interior doors in the south entrance need work—the closing mechanism isn't functioning.
- Light at the top of the stairs to the chapel needs to be replaced. It was flooded.

Craig Richards used his dog catching skills to capture the bat in the kitchen, and saved the day for the Tools for Schools distribution.

Beth has someone coming later in the season to get rid of chimney swift bodies and seal up the chimney in the Ensign house. An outside spicket was broken, spewing water on the inside: plumbing work done.

Charlie refreshed the tape on the stairway to the chapel.

Kristal and Curtis and Cara shared plans for their respective groups. Lilith Seiple (Lily) will be welcomed into youth group during the Sept 10 worship service. Bag tags will be available for church members on that day too. Perhaps there will be a coffee hour after worship. Kristal has plans to engage the children in church. Curtis and Cara will continue to lead the youth in helping with projects, such as setting up Coat racks and making detergent to hand out on distribution day. There is a need for volunteers to prepare a simple child and youth friendly dinner on Wednesdays on the nights when there is not a whole church gathering.

Marsha Karr and Mike Winner have used the choir CDs to develop special music.

The praise band will get back together for rehearsal on Sept. 6.

We are planning to worship together with St. John UCC on October 8 as part of the Johnny Appleseed Festival, contributing \$150 per church to the Village and having free entry for all who come to the church service in the morning. We can use the shelter in case of inclement weather and can gather together afterward for a fellowship meal.

There is a suggestion to worship by the Zonta fountain with a picnic.

Creative concepts will continue to host a pizza dinner and program on the fourth Wednesday of the month. Pam will order pizza and pick up, and do dessert and a side for Sept 27th in Beth and Susan's absence. Program that evening will be a meeting about a possible trip to Mexico next July.

Other potential topics for programs are a fraud specialist from the police and the Nooma videos and discussion.

The next meeting of the MVP will be September 19 at 3 pm in Tecumseh. Pam will attend as elder commissioner.
